Historic Saranac Lake to Open New Exhibit: “125 Years of Science in Saranac Lake”

July 2, 2009, Saranac Lake, New York: The Saranac Laboratory Museum will open a new exhibit on July 18 2009, “125 Years of Science in Saranac Lake.” In partnership with the Trudeau Institute and the Adirondack Museum at Blue Mountain Lake, Historic Saranac Lake has created exhibits celebrating Dr. E.L. Trudeau’s remarkable accomplishments here and marking the 125th Anniversary of the Trudeau Institute.

On opening day, the exhibit will be open from 10:00 – 2:00, with guided tours on the half hour. A \$5 donation is requested.

The Saranac Laboratory, so named by Dr. Edward Livingston Trudeau, is the key to preservation of an important legacy of research and treatment of tuberculosis in Saranac Lake.

For 60 years, the Saranac Laboratory was an active center for experimental research, for education, and for diagnostic services to area patients, doctors, hospitals and sanatoria.

Starting July 18, the Saranac Laboratory Museum is open to the public through October 10, Thursday - Saturday, 10 - 2 pm or by appointment. A \$5 donation is requested. A guided tour occurs at 11:00 AM.

In May Historic Saranac Lake opened a new exhibit, “The Great War: World War I in Saranac Lake” in the John Black Room of the Saranac Laboratory. The WWI exhibit is open to the public to view during the museum hours.
