Museum Expansion Advances

Our project to establish a museum campus in downtown Saranac Lake is advancing smoothly. Construction at the former home and medical office of Dr. E. L. Trudeau is over 30% complete, and we expect the building to be fully rehabilitated by late this fall. We have raised \$5.5 million to support acquisition, design, and construction, including major repairs to the Saranac Laboratory. As the museum expansion moves

forward, we continue to serve local residents and visitors with engaging exhibits and programs. Our new Program Coordinator Alex Krach is busy planning new events. I'm especially excited about a History Day on August 1 commemorating the 80th Anniversary of the death in Saranac Lake of the President of the Philippines, Manuel Quezon. Looking ahead, our board of directors is excited about the second phase of the capital campaign to support the museum exhibits, a handicap lift addition here at the laboratory, and to grow the endowment fund. Generous lead gifts have been secured. We look forward to sharing more about the Three Pillars Campaign and inviting your participation!

2023 was an amazingly successful year at HSL, but it was a sad one for us too. Our dear friend and founding member of HSL, Mary Hotaling, passed away this fall. We also lost our board member and longtime supporter, Andy Rawdon. We miss Mary and Andy every day, and we are grateful for generous donations received in their memory.


Collection News

Exciting Grant-Funded projects!

HSL has recently received several grants to preserve and improve access to the collections!

- Institute of Museum and Library Services two-year grant to support object cataloging and create a plan to move the collection to the Trudeau Building.
- Northern New York Library Network grant to digitize audiovisual material in partnership with George Blood, LP.
- Pomeroy Foundation matching grant to support the purchase of a large-format transparency/negative scanner.
- Lake Placid Education Foundation grant to support cataloging and rehousing journals, pamphlets, and reprints.
- National Network of the Library of Medicine grant to migrate HSL's wiki to a stable long-term hosting solution. Stay tuned for news on this project!
- Gladys Krieble Delmas Foundation grant to support work on the John Black Room Library collection.

New Collections Database Now Online!



We have completed the transition to our new collections management system, CatalogIt! This new system allows collections staff to catalog, search, and manage the collection from any web browser, tablet, or smartphone. This greatly improves our capacity as we work to reconcile and rehouse our collections in preparation for moving the collection and opening our reading room in the Trudeau Building.

The new system is also available to the public online. It offers an improved user interface and easier searching! Newsletter subscribers are getting a sneak peek before the system is announced to the public.



Major progress has been made with masonry repairs, installing the elevator shaft, electrical, plumbing, and much more. Contractors have uncovered various artifacts that help tell the building's history. Pictured right is a beer bottle, recently found in the parlor ceiling. Pieces of dinnerware were found in the rubble under the front foundation. We suspect they might have been there since Trudeau's first home burned to the ground in 1894.
